The downside of using Learning Management Systems



Course authoring: think like a professional educator

Course authoring is central to all LCMSes. Having this feature developed well depicts the difference between a great LCMS and a weaker one.

SCORM certified

Compliance with industry standard software is important as not every single organization or institution will be using the same LMS or LCMS. SCORM packages are easily transferable to another system for delivery and vice versa.
